Our programme of events for the remainder of the year includes a weekend on female Benedictine mystics of the Middle Ages (Hildegard of Bingen, Elisabeth of Schonau, Gertrude the Great and Mechtilde of Hackeborn), on July 10-12. On September 25-27, we will be conducting a weekend on Gregorian chant, which will equip musicians who can read modern musical notation to interpret chant scores.

Joseph Chau, ocso, Novice Master at Tarrawarra, who will present some very illuminating insights into the life, personality and work of St. Bernard of Clairvaux. Several monks of New Norcia, including Fr. David Barry, Dom Paul Forster and my humble self, will also contribute sessions.

In addition to our programmed events, we are delighted to offer 'custom retreats' for groups of six or more, as well as individual guided retreats. The atmosphere of tranquillity and quiet of the monastery, our regular rhythm of prayer, and the natural and artistic beauty of our environment, are all highly conducive to reflection, refreshment and spiritual renewal.
